The family will receive friends from 5-7 p.m., Thursday, Nov. 7 at the funeral home in Dierks.

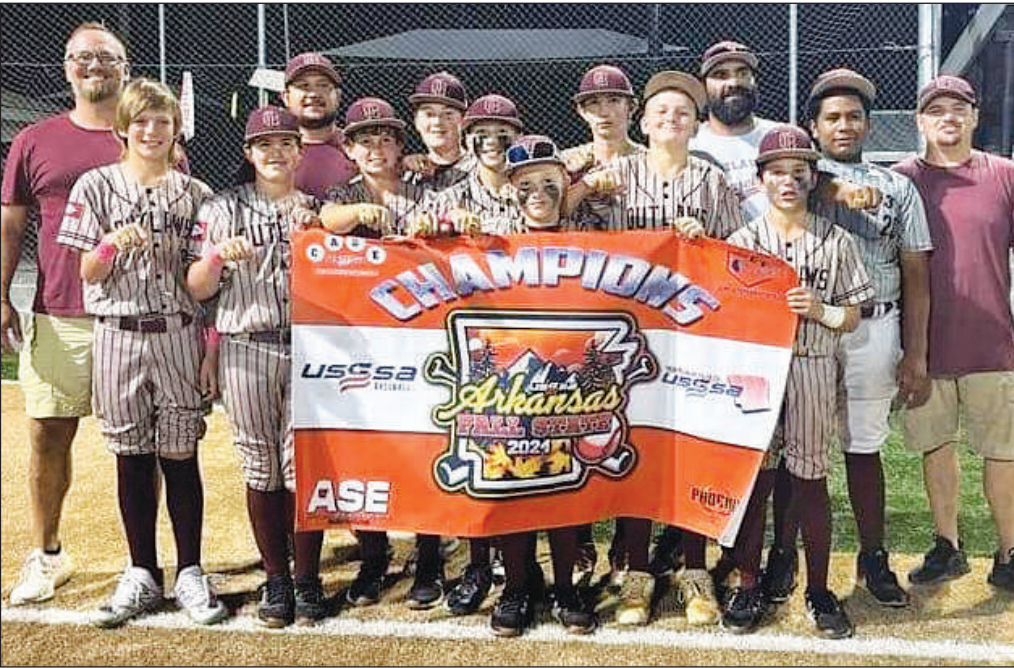

Ten defendants enter pleas of guilty; are sentenced here

On the bench for criminal court, here last Wednesday, Judge Bryan Chesshir sentenced 10 defendants all of whom pleaded guilty or true to felony charges.

Two of the defendants are to return later for formal pronouncement of sentence, although their anticipated sentences are known.

Guilty pleas

Juan Carillo, 38, Hispanic male, Nashville, pleaded guilty to a class D felony drug possession charge. He was sentenced to a year in the Arkansas Department of Correction (ADC) with a further 4 years suspended imposition of sentence.

Charlie Jewell, 53, white male, Nashville, charged with possession of drug paraphernalia, was sentenced to 2 years in the ADC with a further 4 years suspended imposition of sentence.

Bryson LeBlanc, 25, white male, Nashville, pleaded guilty to cattle theft charges and true to failure to meet the terms of his probation on a previous conviction. he was sentenced to 6 years suspended imposition of sentence and must make restitution.

Timothy Walker, 22, black male, Nashville, was sentenced to 6 years in the ADC with a further 10 years suspended imposition of sentence. He was charged with residential burglary and terroristic threatening. In return for the plea the state declined to pursue some charges.

Gary Schrader, 53, white male, Nashville, was sentenced to 3 years in the ADC with

a further 10 years suspended imposition of sentence. He must also forfeit the weapon involved. He had originally been charged with felon in possession of a firearm, and with theft by receiving.

Carolyn Cook, 49, white female, Umpire, was charged with possession of a controlled substance. She was sentenced to 5 years of probation and 90 days in a regional punishment facility. She was also fined \$2,000.

Stanley Bailey, 56, white male, Newhope, pleaded guilty to felon in possession of firearm. He was sentenced to 1 year in the ADC with a further 5 years suspended imposition of sentence.

Cullen Young, 24, black male, Ashdown, charged with damages to a occupiable structure, must make restitution of \$3,385 for damages, and was sentenced to 12 years in the ADC with a further 8 years suspended imposition of sentence. He will return Nov. 19 for formal sentencing.

Timothy Griffin, 46, black male, Nashville had been charged with delivery of controlled substance. The state declined to pursue some charges in return for the guilty plea. He was sentenced to 3 years in the ADC with a further 3 years suspended imposition of sentence.

Semaj Leaks, 19, black male, Mineral Springs, pleaded guilty to a variety of felony charges and was sentenced to 5 years in the ADC with a further 5 years suspended imposition of sentence.

119 years ago: February 1905

It was just eight months to a day from the first move in the county seat contest until the records were landed in Nashville. The contest was short, sharp and decisive.

The location of the courthouse at Nashville will give the town a permanency it has never before had, and all that is necessary to make a first-class town is a little concert of action on the part of all our citizens.

80 years ago: November 1944

Private Jim L. Reed of Nashville, Arkansas, is recovering in a US General Hospital in England. He was hit by shrapnel in the right hip and right foot. Private Reed will be awarded the Purple Heart. Private Reed's wife Mrs. Mattie Reed lives in Nashville and his parents

Mr. and Mrs. Clarence L. Reed reside on a farm in this vicinity. He has two brothers in the service, Sgt. Vestal L. Reed, 23 and Delbert Lee, 21.

Mr. and Mrs. Mark Jackson have received information that their son, Pvt. James Jackson, has arrived safely in England in route to a fighting front with a US Army Infantry Unit. James was in an officer's candidate school when the program for officers was cut and the school he was attending was done away with.

45 years ago: October 1979

In 1961 a group of Howard County men assembled to search for a two-year-old child who had drowned in a creek. Some of those volunteers in that group decided that day that the county needed an organization to help in such cases and in

1963 the Howard County Rescue Unit was formally organized. It was the second rescue unit to be formed in Arkansas. There are about 28 active members in 1979. Bill Dixon is president of the Howard County Rescue Unit.

34 years ago: November 1990

"Teachers today must have the nerves of steel and hearts of gold," Arkansas First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton said Wednesday in a talk to the Nashville Rotary Club on the state of education in Arkansas. Clinton hammered upon the need to improve teachers' salaries as a way to keep good veteran teachers and a way to entice promising new teachers into the profession. In a forty-minute talk she compared national and state educational goals.

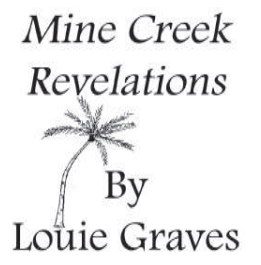
Lovely vacation

Bonuses to be offered nurses working at Arkansas's long-term care facilities

By State Sen. Jimmy Hickey Jr. Direct care nurses who work at long-term facilities operated by the state are eligible for a bonus of \$5,000. Newly hired nurses are also eligible for bonuses, but the \$5,000 would be paid in installments over several months.

The goal is to reduce the state's use of "travelling" nurses, who are hired through agencies temporarily. Last fiscal year the state paid for about 173,000 hours of contract nursing.

The state Department of Human Services operates the State Hospital in Little Rock for people with mental illness. It also operates the Arkansas Health Center formerly known as the Benton Services Center, a psychiatric nursing home for the elderly and people with disabilities.

The department also operates five Human Development Centers for people with severe intellectual and developmental disabilities. They are in Arkadelphia, Booneville, Bradley County, Conway and Jonesboro.

Registered nurses and licensed practical nurses will be eligible for bonuses, but certified nurse assistants will not.

The department proposed the bonuses, which were approved

by the Personnel Subcommittee of the Legislative Council. The joint Committees on Public Health, Welfare and Labor also reviewed details of the bonus program before it took effect on November 1.

Legislators and DHS officials acknowledged that one-time bonuses would not be an adequate long-term fix for staffing shortages. Higher salaries for nurses at state facilities will be addressed during the 2025 regular session, when legislators consider a new state employee pay plan. The session begins in January.

The state's top personnel director told lawmakers that nurses' salaries would be a priority in the pay plan.

In Fiscal Year 2024, which ended on June 30, the state paid contract nurses \$4.8 million to work about 70,000 hours at the State Hospital. The state paid \$3.2 million for 50,000 hours of nursing at the Arkansas Health Center and \$3.24 million for 53,000 hours at human development centers. However, the center at Booneville did not require the use of any contract nurses. In comparison, the cost of bonuses to full-time nurses will total \$1.26 million, department officials said.

Legislators have heard from

family members of clients at the human development centers about the use of contract nurses. No legislator voiced concerns about the quality of care provided by travelling nurses, but several said that full-time nurses could get to know better the long-term needs of clients. Thus, permanent nurses could provide better care simply by providing continuity of care.

In trying to make salaries of full-time state nurses competitive with travelling nurses, the department doesn't have to match salaries dollar for dollar. That's because the state doesn't have to pay for fringe benefits for travelling nurses. The value of fringe benefits provides an additional 30 to 32 percent to the compensation paid to state nurses, a department official said.

The fringe benefits brings state nurse salaries closer to a competitive level. Recently, the department re-hired seven nurses who had gone to work for contract nursing agencies.

State facilities will probably continue to rely on contract nurses, if at reduced levels, in order to maintain staffing levels. Long-term care facilities must have available a certain number of nurses per client, to be licensed and to qualify for federal funding.

Good news abounds throughout Arkansas

By U.S. Sen. John Boozman Mister Rogers once encouraged his young viewers, during difficult times, to look for the "helpers" – because seeing others step forward to offer aid as well as hope was certain to lift their own spirits.

Many times we even export them to support others around our country or across the globe.

Recent natural disasters have given rise to examples of Arkansans volunteering their time and expertise on behalf of those experiencing hardships. Hurricanes Milton and Helene, which unleashed extreme damage on states across the South, prompted dozens of our families, friends and neighbors to leap into action and find ways to assist the recovery efforts.

Our linemen descended on Florida to help restore power, with two Arkansans even saving a man nearly swept away in floodwaters. Arkansas Southern Baptists mobilized to provide disaster relief aid in Georgia.

Mercy Hospital nurses from Northwest Arkansas volunteered to help provide medical care in North Carolina. Firefighters from around the state joined Arkansas National Guardsmen to help perform search and rescue missions while other Natural State Guardsmen prepared a large shipment of "Meals, Ready to Eat" (MREs) for victims.

The Red Cross of Arkansas also sent dozens of members to help displaced survivors find shelter in addition to working around the clock to serve hot meals, deliver clean-up supplies and offer emotional support.

We've also lived through severe weather at home bringing out the best in Arkansans.

When heavy rains recently made roads impassable and stranded a couple at their home in Flippin, a local first responder took to horseback to deliver their vital medication. In the wake of devastating tornadoes earlier this year, countless individuals and organizations took action to help their neighbors clear debris and start to rebuild their lives, homes

and businesses.

All year long, there is never a shortage of selflessness and heroism among members of law enforcement and the communities they serve.

In the last few months, police officers in Hoxie, Conway and Lawrence County, as well as an Arkansas State Trooper, have all been recognized for life-saving actions they took while on duty.

Another consistent source of exciting and welcome stories comes from our students. This summer, two Bryant High School juniors took home the top national honors at the 2024 SkillsUSA competition in the audio and radio production category, while Russellville High School's Quiz Bowl team brought home a national championship.

Generosity and empathy are staples in Arkansas. Perhaps the best recent example was seen when a 40-year veteran of Baptist Health's team retired. She'd struggled to secure reliable transportation, so her coworkers raised money to purchase her a car, which she received on her last day.

There really is no place like this state and, in large part, that is thanks to our people. We are the helpers and should always watch for that to play out every day, through big and small gestures, and take the opportunity to appreciate it.

Set-up time is three to five minutes, according to Graham.

The system will be ready for use in the near future.

Graham reviewed the district's scores on the state's new ATLAS tests, which were administered for the first time during the 2024 spring semester.

Test results included the following:

The district was above the state average in every grade level for English/Language arts except third and fourth.

NSD was above the state average in math at every level except Algebra I and Geometry.

Nashville was above the state average in science except for grades 6 and 7.

Sixth grade exceeded the state average in every subject area and was ranked first in the De Queen/Mena Educational Cooperative in math.

Seventh grade was above the state average in every subject area.

Fifth grade missed this by a couple of points on the science section.

Nashville fifth graders had the highest ELA score for the district at 43 percent,

six points above the state average.

Sixth grade was second with 40 percent, seven points above the state.

Ninth grade was third with 37 percent, four points above the state average.

Sixth grade had the district's top math scores with 54 percent, 16 points above the state.

Fifth grade was second at 50 percent, 12 points higher than the state.

Fourth and eighth grades tied for third at 41 percent. The eighth grade was 13 points above the state average, with fourth grade three points above.

Seventh grade had the highest science score with 38 percent, two points above state. Sixth grade was second with 34 percent, two points ahead of the state average.

Teachers and administrators are continuing to analyze the test results.

Joining Graham at the meeting were Assistant Superintendent Tate Gordon, Curriculum Coordinator Kim Slayton, Director of Athletics, Facilities and Transportation James "Bunch" Nichols, and campus administrators Nathan Evans, Tyra Hughes, Hannah Topor, Eric Perez and Ashley Riggs.

"I'm proud to work with that group," Graham said.

and there are no houses or clearings up there to spoil the view. The ridges and mountains are basically untouched, and look as they must have to Native Americans centuries ago.

The colors of the leaves are so bright that they look fake. How can they be real and be such vibrant shades? Yellow to gold, light red to crimson, everywhere you look there is an explosion of color. Then you get to Maryland, with more mountains and more color.

After crossing through part of Maryland, you go over the Potomac River and into Pennsylvania. Still practically no evergreens, and everywhere you look you see an amazing panorama of hardwood trees in varying shades. For an Arkie like me, it doesn't make me want to move there, but it does make me wish we had maples throughout Arkansas. They are abundant in Virginia, Maryland, and Pennsylvania, and their deep red, almost burgundy color, is astounding. Then, after 1,500 miles, it's time to turn around and head home.

Heading west out of Pennsylvania, you cross into West Virginia. If you've never been through West Virginia, then you need to put it on your bucket list. Called the Mountain State, it's the only state that is completely within the Appalachians. The ground elevation varied from 1,100 feet above sea level to 3,000 feet on our drive, with the peaks of the mountains towering almost a half mile above, and covered with

hardwood.

A small portion of our journey carried us into coal mining country, with the western slopes of the mountains being scarred by strip-mining. Finally, thankfully, you leave coal country and get back into the beautiful, completely forested mountains.

Crossing the Big Sandy River from West Virginia into Kentucky, you'll see fewer hardwoods and more pasture land. No surprise—Kentucky, home of the Kentucky Derby, is horse country, and horse ranches abound. The steeper ridges still have color, and the flatter countryside, even without trees, is beautiful. After a few hours of hills and ranches, you're back in Tennessee, and then home to Arkansas.

Fall is a wonderful time of year. Not very long ago, Howard County was covered in oak and hickory. Sadly, that is no longer true. But if you have time and gasoline, you can still enjoy the beauty that God created.

Our friends Sam and Sue White are also gainfully unemployed travelers and "leafers." While we were in Pennsylvania, they were in New England. After talking to them, I think I know where we'll head next fall.

Rattlers whip Spring Hill Bears 42-8

MS Hornets coming Thursday night for season finale

The Murfreesboro Rattlers (7-2, 6-0) extended their winning streak to seven games with a 42-8 win over Spring Hill (2-7, 1-5) at home last Friday night.

Lathan Compton would rack up 148 rushing yards on 11 attempts to lead the Rattler ground game. Brody Maroon had 73 yards and two touchdowns on 14 attempts.

Cameron Stevens and Bubba Stinson each had a rushing touchdown, while quarterback Laytan Wilcher found the end zone twice.

Wilcher was 1/1 in the passing game, while backup Kooper Caldwell was 2/5 later in the game.

Caldwell caught the pass from Wilcher for 23 yards, while Isaac Kuykendall had a reception for 32 yards.

On defense, Maroon would lead the team with nine tackles and Albert Quiroz tallied eight stops. Stinson, Stevens and Logan Burris had six tackles each, with

Caden Dixon, Caleb DeLaRosa and Kale Burns had four each.

Head coach Brad Chesshir said it was a nice win coming off the emotional win the week previous over Junction City. While his team was a “bit sloppy” in the first half, he credited the squad with “taking care of business overall.”

“It’s a little nerve wracking to go up against a team with nothing to play for and I like the way we handled the game.”

He said Spring Hill was a competitive team that was not necessarily indicative of their lopsided record, and felt that the weight of the season was perhaps wearing on them in the past few weeks.

Ultimately, he said that growth was the only takeaway from a blowout win, and he felt his team did in fact get better this past week.

This week the Rattlers will host the Mineral Springs Hornets (5-4, 4-2), who dropped their contest

last week versus Dierks 18-8. The game will conclude the regular season for both team.

With the Hornets’ loss last week, the Rattlers officially secured the 3-2A conference title for 2024, win or lose in the season finale.

The number one seed will place the Rattlers in the top slot in the upper half of the bracket, guaranteeing them home field advantage throughout the playoffs until the championship game – should they advance to that point.

However, before the Rattlers can begin to worry about the playoffs, they must face off against the rival Hornets in a game that won’t match the intensity of last year’s version that saw both teams come into the finale with perfect records.

Chesshir said that the Hornets lost a couple of key players off last year’s squad (Jace Amerson and K.T. Thomas) and have dealt with numerous injuries this season, including to Javeon Fricks.

“They’ve had to deal with injuries and figure out what works for them and their identity each week.”

Of course the Hornets feature a number of excellent athletes, including RB/LB Malik Matthews and senior QB Evan Erwin.

“Erwin can throw a decent deep ball and is good on his feet,” said Chesshir, adding that the receivers are adept at finding windows for completions.”

He says the Hornets’ offense has changed over the course of the season in order to maximize personnel and to take advantage of weekly matchups, so Chesshir said he doesn’t really know specifically what to expect from Mineral Springs this week.

“They were in a double wing formation for three weeks and then came out in the wishbone versus Dierks.”

However, Chesshir credits the Hornets’ defense as “the strength of the team ... they swarm well”

and definitively states that MLB Rahmaij Ware is one of the “best linebackers in all of 2-A football in my opinion that covers sideline to sideline.”

Chesshir said the Rattlers will have to be physical at the point of attack and take advantage of small factors they hope to identify through game film.

“We will have to see what weaknesses we can take advantage of,” said Chesshir of preparations this week.

With the game set for Thursday night, Chesshir said he foresees no difference in the short week for his squad as far as readiness.

“It will have no effect, we will do the same things.”

Additionally, he is trying to keep things even keel this week, despite it being a rivalry game in the final week of the season.

“There is no added pressure this week ... it’s just another football game.”

Dierks Outlaws & The 2024 Howard County Cup

Outlaws take back HoCo Cup from MS Hornets 18-8

The Dierks Outlaws moved into third place in the Class 3-2A standings following Friday night's 18-8 road win over the Mineral Springs Hornets in the Battle for the Howard County Cup.

Dierks (4-2/6-3) now sits below #2 Junction City (5-1/6-3) and #1 Murfreesboro (6-0/7-2) in the standings and above the MS Hornets (4-2/5-4).

The Hornets will travel to Murfreesboro this Thursday night to close out the regular season on Holloway Field at Rattler Stadium. The Outlaws will stay home Thursday to host the Gurdon Go-Devils, currently lurking in fifth place with a 3-3/4-5 record.

Outlaw Coach Paul Ernest posted on social media that Dierks fans, no matter how much it pains them, should be rooting for the Rattlers Thursday night to knock the MS Hornets out of the four-team playoff bracket.

MS Coach Jason Hathcock said it was "penalties, busted plays, fumbles, dropped passes and overall sloppy execution on both sides of the ball" that resulted in the Howard County Cup leaving Mineral Springs Friday and going back in the Outlaw trophy case.

"Hats off to Dierks," Hathcock added. "They came ready to play and executed well."

The coach also said the Hornets will have to "get out of our own way" to get past the #1 Rattlers Thursday night.

The Outlaws opened the scoring on the first possession of game at MS. Starting from their own 44, Dierks worked with running backs Jordan Hill and Grayson Kersey to move down field and used a MS penalty and a big pass to Juan Salazar to move to the one-yard line. Quarterback Peyton Boeckman ducked in for the score but Kason Dougan's extra-point kick banged off the goalpost for a 6-0 lead with 6:48 left in the opening quarter.

The Hornets' first possession showed promise after starting on their own 35 but two incomplete passes gave the Outlaws the ball back on

their own 27 with 2:35 left in the first.

Hill, Kersey and Salazar continued to be the workhorses on the Outlaws' next drive that spilled into the second quarter. On the 12th play of the drive, the Outlaws fumbled the ball over to MS and the home team took over at the 38.

Minerals Springs got back on the field with 10:48 left in the half for a drive that crashed five plays in when they fumbled the ball back to Dierks at the Hornet 44.

The Hornet defense stood up the next Outlaw drive and they were forced to punt with 7:42 left in the half. The Outlaw defense responded with a stand of its own and MS punted the ball away.

The punt set the Outlaws up at MS 40 and it took Dierks just one play from the speedy Hill to hit the end zone for is more points. The kick failed to set the score at 12-0.

The Hornets put the ball on the ground again in their next possession and Dierks took over at their own 49. The Outlaws drove down to the one-yard line but were turned back by the Hornet defense.

The Hornets took over at the one with 1:41 left in the half and marched down to the Dierks 13 before two incomplete passes killed the drive as the halftime clock stopped on a 12-0 Outlaw lead.

session went into the fourth quarter and was stopped after only four plays by the Outlaw defense.

Dierks took over at the 31 and six plays later Hill was scoring from five yards with a successful two-point play to close out the game's scoring and set the 18-8 final.

The Outlaw defense shut

down the Hornets' final drive of the game when Justin Humphreys picked a Hornet pass.

Dierks managed 288 yards of offense with QB Boeckman hitting 3/6 passes for 84 yards.

The rushing game earned 204 yards on 54 carries with Hill carrying the ball 26

times for 128 yards and two touchdowns. Adding to the rushing total were Kersey with 20 for 77 yards, Salazar with two for six yards and Drake Thatcher with one for two yards.

Boeckman's receivers were Salazar (2/53 yards) and Ben Ernest (1/34 yards).

Kersey (7), Jordan Hill

(7), Jeron Hill (7) and Dougan (9) topped the Outlaw tackle chart with six solo stops from Salazar.

Matthews led the Hornet offense with 18 carries for 131 yards and Ervin hit 3/13 passes for 35 yards with five drops.

Erwin also rushed the ball six times for 54 yards.

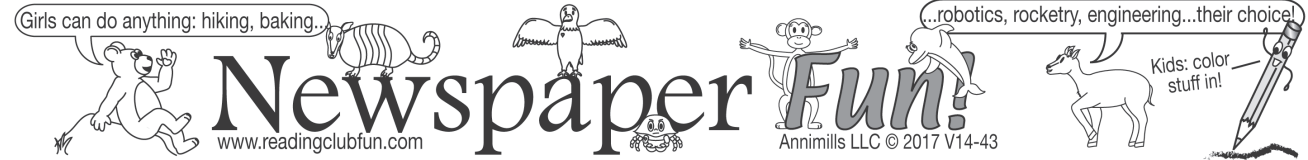

Months of drought conditions complicate winter feed strategies

The dry, warm autumn experienced by much of Arkansans’ pasture lands will likely mean the state’s cattle producers will have to start feeding hay earlier and longer, experts with the University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture said.

Kenny Simon, extension forage educator for the Division of Agriculture, said the extended drought has both impacted the growth of fescue, the state’s most common cool-season perennial grass, and delayed the planting of warm-season perennial grasses.

“Everyone’s scared to plant because of how dry it is,” Simon said. “As a result of that delayed planting, we’re going to have a delayed growing period.”

While bermudagrass, for example, is normally planted between mid-September and mid-November, many producers won’t be able to plant until November at the earliest, he said. This likely means the grass won’t be available for grazing until later than normal in spring.

Meanwhile, Simon said, the state’s fescue pastures are growing unusually sparse in many fields across the state.

“A lot of our pastures are getting grazed down really short right now,” Simon said. “What growth remains is getting grazed

really close to the ground, which opens up the canopy for undesirable broadleaf weeds and other grasses. It’s weakening the root systems of those perennial grasses.”

From grass to cattle

Sparse forage and elevated feed prices can often lead producers to decide it’s better to sell off a cow than overwinter it, but cattle producers in Arkansas and surrounding states have already exercised that option for much of the past five years.

James Mitchell, extension livestock economist for the Division of Agriculture, said that much of the U.S. cattle industry has been in a “liquidation phase,” with producers culling herds for much of the last five years.

“We’re coming off a couple of years of some pretty hard liquidation,” Mitchell said. “Our herd sizes are already pretty moderated, so I don’t see culling decisions being accelerated, just because we don’t have a lot of cows to start with.”

Grass in the tank

Fortunately, many Arkansas producers were able to get two cuttings of hay earlier in the year and have stockpiled enough to get through at least a normal year, he said.

And while 2024 isn’t shaping up to be a normal year in this instance, it’s better than nothing.

“The drought hit late enough in the season that

most producers had adequate hay on hand by the time things got bad,” Simon said.

“I think most folks got the hay they need for a normal year, but these fall droughts may force people to start feeding three to four weeks early. When you compound that with planting annuals later than normal, we’re going to end up feeding hay a lot longer than most people anticipated.”


Simon recommended that growers try to make any remaining forage last by using moveable electric fence to “strip graze,” the process of confining a herd to a specific area for a set period of time before allowing them access to other grazing areas.

“Give the cows a limited supply of forage, maybe two to three days, or maybe even move them just once a week,” Simon said.

“What we’re trying to do with strip grazing is improve the use of the forage and get it passed through to the animal.

“Once you start feeding hay, confine those animals to one pasture,” he said.

“Maybe it’s a field that’s low in soil fertility and we improve it with the cows’ waste as fertilizer. By rotating the cows onto a different field every two to three weeks, we can spread the fertilization out over a broader area, instead of concentrating it in one field.”

State police makes another arrest for child sexual abuse material in Pike County

Another investigation by the Arkansas State Police Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) has netted another Pike County resident on charges related to child pornography.

Charges in Pike County are currently pending against Roy Oleyte, 46, of Glenwood, according to Pike County Investigator Jason McDonald. Oleyte, who arrested and booked in the county jail on Oct. 29, is expected to be charged with one count of distributing, possessing or viewing of matter depicting sexually explicit conduct involving a child. He is being held on \$100,000 bond.

Oleyte is accused of using BitTorrent to download child pornography.

A search warrant was executed at the defendant's Lakeshore Street apartment on Oct. 29 and his phone was seized. A forensic search found child sexual abuse material and a further evaluation of the phone is pending.

Charges Filed

A Glenwood woman is facing a charge of failure to comply with registering requirements of being a sex offender.

Anna Louis Davis, 40, was charged Oct. 30. Davis has a history of not meeting requirements stemming from her sex offender status involving a 2008 incident in Garland County. She has been charged at least two others times with the offense. A compliance check on Oct. 25 at Davis' home on Dennis Street found her to be in violation again and

she was taken into custody Oct. 27. She remains in the county jail this week.

On Oct. 30, a charge of possession of of methamphetamine with purpose to deliver was filed against Joseph Viola, 41, of Delight.

A search warrant was conducted by Pike County deputies on Oct. 23 at Viola's home on Water Street in Delight where close to 13 grams of meth were recovered.

Viola plead not guilty to the charge Monday and a Jan. 27 pretrial date was set. He remains in custody this week on \$20,000 bond.

Also on Oct. 30, two felony charges were filed against Matthew Bearden, 41, of Delight. He is charged with second-degree domestic battery and first-degree terroristic threatening. He was arrested on Oct. 27 following an incident where Bearden allegedly threatened and physical attacked family members.

Bearden plead not guilty to the charge Monday and a March 3 pretrial date was set. He remains in county custody this week on \$10,000 bond.

Accused former Delight pastor, James Vincent Henry, 43, was scheduled for a hearing on Monday, Nov. 4 but the hearing has been reset for Nov. 15 due to the fact no charges have been filed in Pike County. The Arkansas State Police is handling the case against Henry, who is accused of 100 counts involving child sexual abuse material.

Henry is still in county custody and is being held on \$50,000 bond.



Game & Fish knocks out invasive plant at Millwood state park

Boat traffic has resumed in areas of Millwood Lake that were affected by the discovery of Cuban bulrush, an aquatic invasive plant, according to the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission’s southwest region fisheries office.

Dylan Hann, AGFC district fisheries supervisor in Perrytown, said a containment boom to restrict the movement of floating pieces of Cuban bulrush near the Millwood State Park access, were modified so boaters can drive through it and reach spots to fish. It’s like a floating oil containment boom used with spills, and this one has been shaped to let boaters navigate through it while preventing the plant from spreading outside of the cove. “It’s similar to the containment that we have at boat ramps on Lake Columbia to prevent another invasive floating plant, giant salvinia, from congregating at the boat ramp and spreading to new waters” he said.

A contractor has sprayed the areas with Cuban bulrush twice this month, Hann said. This has helped knock the plant back, Hann added.

The plant “does produce seeds, so it’s likely going to produce new plants from the seed bank next spring. We’re going to work closely with the Millwood Corps of Engineers staff to make sure we stay on top of it. If we can knock it back next year before it produces seeds, we can get ahead of it,” he said.

Cuban bulrush looks

like other aquatic grasses and sedges for much of the year, then around July to August it produces very noticeable seed heads that make it stand out as something clearly different from other lake vegetation. Millwood Lake also has mats of alligatorweed that the AGFC is treating through contractor spraying, and Cuban bulrush has been found growing on top of the alligatorweed, Hann noted. Cuban bulrush is a floating plant and is commonly found growing on top of other floating or emergent aquatic vegetation. It can quickly choke out shallow areas, creating dense floating mats that can block boating and fishing access and displace native native plants that are beneficial to native fish and wildlife, he added.

Cuban bulrush was likely transported to Millwood Lake from another waterbody unknowingly, by plant fragments or seeds hitching

a ride on boats or trailers, which is how most invasive aquatic plants are spread to new waters.

The boating and angling public can help with stopping the spread of this and other aquatic invasive species by practicing: “Clean, Drain and Dry.” The public is urged to clean their boat, trailer and equipment after each use, completely drain all water from the boat and all compartments, and dry thoroughly. Also, the public is urged to keep an eye out for any suspicious plants (native or not) and report them to your local fisheries biologists. Be sure to note the location of the sighting and take a photo that includes the roots, leaves and flowers.

If you suspect you’ve come across an invasive aquatic plant, please report it online at www.agfc.com/ans. Reports are used to help AGFC rapidly respond to contain and eradicate, if possible, new invasive species

introductions before they can spread and establish.

The discovery of Cuban bulrush in Millwood was made only when an AGFC biologist doing bass sampling recently noticed the unusual pods in the aquatic vegetation.

“There are areas of the lake in expansive backwater sloughs that have Cuban bulrush with no way to effectively contain them with containment booms,” Hann said. “One advantage we had with the state park is it’s an isolated place where there isn’t any Cuban bulrush immediately outside that boom along the dam or along the northwest bank leaving the state park, so we were just trying to keep that area contained,” Hann said. “The booms are there to help catch floating vegetation. We want it to be contained there and not drift to other parts in the lake. We put out 800 feet of containment boom at the state park.”
