## Centerpoint opens new elementary facility

Centerpoint School District had its' Elementary School ribbon cutting ceremony on Thursday, May 11, 2017, while the several hundred people who attended, the administration, the staff and the students had their wishes fulfilled on two major issues.

The ominous clouds gathered and swirled, but the rains held off through the ceremony. It continued to stay away until the K-3 students loaded back up on the buses and headed back to the Glenwood Primary. The second issue was the completion of the new facility, and that has been accomplished through the hard work of everyone involved.

Back in 2014, the school district patrons approved a millage increase to construct an elementary school on the high school campus. This was the culmination of a long standing promise to bring the Amity and Glenwood students to the high school campus at Rosboro.

The project began when all the approvals and paperwork was finished. The project was estimated to cost \$10 million with \$5.5 million to come from the State of Arkansas Department of Education, and \$5 million to be raised locally through a millage increase and extension of the present debt.

Two school board meetings back, Superintendent Dan Breshears informed the School Board that the contractors had brought the project in under budget. The exact amount was unknown, but it was a substantial amount. The ribbon cutting on May 11 was attended by personnel from the architect firm, the construction company, financiers, local government officials who donated manpower and machinery. The children still at the Glenwood Primary were bused over and several hundred well wishers and supporters of the project attended. The ceremony went well and quickly. Student Chloe Archer welcomed the people who came

to the event. Director of Maintenance and Transportation Jimmy Forsythe led the crowd in a prayer for their new facility and thanked all who supported the construction. Musical Director Diane Kelly had the fourth and fifth graders well prepared for their presentation as soloist Hadley Gaddis delighted the audience. The superintendent then spoke to the students on the theme of Dedication, Ownership and Gratitude. "We are here to dedicate the opening of the facility. He continued with the topic of ownership telling the students they owned the facility and it was up to them to assist in keeping it clean and a safe place to be. He ended with

informing the students that gratitude was also an important part of the theme. They should be grateful for all the hard work done to bring the facility to them." Zac Oosterhous gave the *See Ribbon, Page 4*

## Tax Delinquent Land Sale scheduled for Pike County

(May 15, 2017) LITTLE ROCK, Ark - The public auction for the sale of tax delinquent land in Pike County will be held at the Pike County Courthouse on Thursday, June 1, at 1 p.m., according to John Thurston, Arkansas Commissioner State Lands. Registration will begin at 12:30 p.m. The Commissioner of State Lands offers an online Catalog of Tax Delinquent Lands, which contains the current statutes governing the sales, auction dates, times, location and other pertinent information regarding parcels being offered. The catalog can be found on the Commissioner's website at www.cosl.org, providing current information resources about each parcel. "Bidding begins at the amount of taxes and fees that are due," Thurston said. "Owners of delinquent parcels should remember that they have only 10 business days to redeem their property if it sells at auction." Delinquent property owners may call the office at 501-324-9422 to request a Petition to Redeem, or they may look up the delinquent parcel on the COSL website and print it from there.

## Former Montgomery County G&FC officer promoted to colonel to lead Enforcement Division

Greg Rae was recently promoted to colonel to lead the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission's Enforcement Division. He succeeds Pat Fitts, who recently was promoted to assistant deputy director at the agency. "Greg has continuously demonstrated his abilities while serving in multiple leadership positions within the Enforcement Division throughout his career with the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission," Fitts said. "Most recently, his service as major demonstrated very clearly that he possesses the dedication and vision to meet the challenges that are com-

mon in the law enforcement field." Rae, 48, says he told his father he wanted to be a game warden when he was 14 during a Colorado mule deer hunt. "Thirteen years later, my dream came true," said Rae, who was born in Denver. He came to the profession naturally; his father was a sheriff. Rae began working with the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office in 1989, and attended the Arkansas Law Enforcement Training Academy while he was a deputy sheriff. He was hired by the AGFC in 1995 and was assigned to Montgomery County, where he worked for 22 years. Rae became a lieutenant in 2003, was promoted to captain in 2011 and moved to AGFC headquarters in Little Rock as a major in 2016. "I worked alongside some great leaders while there this past 15 months and, with

those experiences, my wife, my son and a whole lot more prayer, I threw my name in the hat for colonel," Rae said. "It is a decision that wasn't made lightly; it is a position that I never imagined myself being in but always admired and respected." Rae and other AGFC wildlife officers have seen their jobs evolve over the years. "Our job duties have changed drastically since I started in 1995," Rae said. "When beginning my career, it was just being a game warden. Since then, we are heavily involved with every aspect of law enforcement duties." Rae is a graduate of the Criminal Justice Institute/UALR School for Law Enforcement Supervision and the FBI National Academy. "Regardless of his rank with this agency, and throughout his career as a wildlife officer, Greg has consistently



demonstrated a true heart for public service that will serve him well as he steps into this new role," Fitts said. Rae's aspirations have led him to this point. "I was always told to find a job you love and you will never work a day in your life; that's the case for me," Rae said. "I couldn't be more proud to be selected to lead these extraordinary men and women of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission Law Enforcement Division."

## Suspicious activity report turns in felony drug charges

An incident on May 2 which began as a report of suspicious activity at Glenwood's Broadway Apartments has led to three people being arrested on felony drug charges.

Charged is Jacob C. Moss, 38, of Glenwood, possession of methamphetamine; John W. Meeks, 37, of Norman, possession of drug paraphernalia; and Kristen B. Davis, 22, of Norman, possession of drug paraphernalia. The trio was charged May 11 in Pike County Circuit Court. Moss' has been set at \$7,500 and a \$5,000 bond has been set for both Davis and Meeks.

Glenwood officers Justin Babbitt and Jessica Babbitt were initially called to the apartments to investigate a report of suspicious activity when they noticed two people "react to their presence" and get into a vehicle and drive away. The vehicle was stopped for no license plate as it turned in at Oak Park Apartments. A female passenger, later identified as Davis, was seen throwing two objects out of the window. The items were recovered and found to be syringes loaded with a liquid substance. A metal smoking pipe was also recovered from the vehicle and Davis and Meeks, who was driving on a suspended license, were taken into custody.

A statement from Davis about the suspicious activity call and the possible presence of drugs led officers back to Broadway Apartments where Moss was arrested, as was Ted Pate, no age available, of Glenwood, on an outstanding Glenwood warrant. Pate was also charged with misdemeanor possession of controlled substance for two Xanax pills found on his person.

## Rape charges filed

A rape charged has been filed against a 40-year-old Kirby man accused of having sexual relations with a minor during an eight-year period.

Josh M. Barrett was officially charged May 11 in Pike County Circuit Court. His bond was set at \$100,000 May 8 by Judge Charles Yeagan.

Barrett is charged with allegedly engaging in sexual relations "by forcible compulsion" with a female less than 14 years of age during a time period 2005 to 2013, according to court records.

In a statement to law officials, Barrett stated he was on drugs during the time period and has no recollection of the allegations.

## Multiple felony drug charges filed in M'boro

Multiple felony drug charges are expected to be filed this week against a Murfreesboro man arrested Sunday, May 14 with more than 30 grams of methamphetamine.

Deral Dwain Plunk, 54, was arrested by Murfreesboro Officer David Shelby after he was stopped for speeding through residential streets. The stop took place when Plunk turned his vehicle into the Church of Christ parking lot and pulled "up close to the front door of the church and stopped." Court records indicate families were arriving at the church at the time of the incident.

Plunk exited the vehicle twice during the stop and Officer Shelby noticed he was sweating profusely and acting nervous. When questioned about his active parole status Plunk reportedly began using obscene language and tried to slam Shelby's hand in the vehicle door. He was taken into custody for disorderly conduct.

An inventory of Plunk's vehicle found a Crown Royal bag 16 separate plastic bags containing 31 grams of suspected methamphetamine, suspected marijuana, digital scales, a straw and a syringe loaded with suspected methamphetamine.

Plunk admitted to officers that he was selling and using the drug.

No bond has been set yet for the case.

## PC Justices approve part time summer help, tax resolution and library ordinance

MURFREESBORO - The Pike County Justices of the Peace worked through a short agenda Monday night, May 15, in an hour long meeting which included approving an ordinance to abolish the existing Library Board and establish a new one.

After the routine business of approving prior meeting minutes and County Treasurer Loletia Rather reading aloud departmental fund balances, income and expenses, the Justices went on to other business.

County Clerk Sandy Campbell read an ordinance required by the State of Arkansas Audit Department. It covered abolishing the existing Library Board of Directors, establishing a new board, and vesting that new board with the responsibility of maintaining all the facilities, inventory and providing the County Clerk with the new Library Board meeting minutes.

The state auditors found that the existing library system, while working excellently, had not been established by an ordinance all those years ago. It is required that an ordinance be done as the system is using tax payer money for part of its operating expenses.

The ordinance was read once, the rules suspended to skip the second and third reading because of an emergency clause in the ordinance, and passed 6-0.

County Judge Dewight Mack then asked for a motion to approve the hiring of two part time people to help with the road department in keeping the county maintained roadways mowed and clean. Neither person will work enough hours each week to be considered full time. Therefore they will not be on the health insurance or pension plans.

Judge Mack said each would be paid minimum wage, be for eight to ten weeks duration and cost the county a little less than \$10,000 for the pair. A motion was made, seconded and approved 6-0.

Mrs. Shelaine Davis then spoke to the Justices on finding ways to help the emergency 9-1-1 system to be upgraded and improved.

She spoke of the fine job the ambulance system and First Responders do. But believed the county needs to find a way to assist the First Responders in any way possible as they are all volunteers. There would be no pay involved, but possibly help them with purchasing gasoline, or tires, or vehicle accessories.

Davis posed some questions to the Justices. Do we need another dispatcher? How do we get a small portion of taxes collected to aid in the upgrade and improvement of the emergency system?

Davis said she was very early in the time frame of asking questions, and would appreciate any suggestions or help the Justices could provide.

Judge Mack stated he believed Davis was on the right track, and the county would endeavor to assist in any way they possibly could.

A resolution was then brought forward asking the Quorum Court to provide support for Caddo River Forest Products to participate in the Tax Back Program offered by the State of Arkansas for companies who establish a new business or expand an existing one.

Justice Johnny Plyler stated Caddo River Forest Products has estimated it will spend \$28 million dollars on the plant located in Glenwood. The Tax Back Program allows businesses to ask for ten percent of the money spent on sales tax to be returned to them.

The Pike County Quorum Court approved the resolution supporting Caddo River Forest Products by a 7-0 vote.

The number of votes on the issues covered this night gradually increased as some of the Justices hurried from work to the meeting.

## Caddo Hills School Board meeting

The Caddo Hills School Board filled several positions in the elementary school as well as the cafeteria during their most recent school board meeting.

After an hour long executive session the board resumed the public portion of the meeting to fill two certified and two paraprofessional positions on the elementary campus.

Alora Standridge and Savanna Massey were hired to fill vacant certified teaching positions and Katie Gillenwater and Mary Ivy were hired to fill two vacant paraprofessional positions.

The board also voted to promote Melissa Lybrand to the position of Food Service Director and Rebecca Darden to the position of Cafeteria Manager.

The board also adopted the Statement of Assurance and approve the Preliminary Special Education Budget for the 2017-2018 school year.

The board approved the annual Proposed Budget of Expenditures with Tax Levy for the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 2018 to and including June 30, 2019.

Superintendent Deric Owens discussed a recent education tour held in Washington D.C. he participated in recently.

## Donnie Davis of Lodi fills in Verl Stovall JP position of PC QC

MURFREESBORO -- Donnie Davis of Lodi was sworn in as the District 6 Justice of the Peace on the Pike County Quorum Court on Friday.

Davis is a fill-in for Verl Stovall, who vacated the position after moving out of the area.

His term will last through December 31, 2018.

A school administrator and educator by trade over the past forty-five years, Davis recently came out of retirement to take over the superintendent position at Cossatot River School District.

"I've been a citizen of Pike County since I was eleven-years-old, and I have always just kind of stood on the side," he said, noting he did serve on the Democratic Central Committee in the 1970's. "I've always tried to serve the public without coming forward [to seek a role]," said Davis.

He has worked in many local school districts over his career, including Kirby for 22 years, for whom he is also an alum and a former all-state basketball player. He has also spent time working in the Blevins, Bismarck and Dierks school districts.

"I've retired, and I keep getting called back in," he quipped.

Davis and his wife, who have been married forty-four years, also owns and operates a legacy farm that was certified as a Century Farm by the program developed by the Arkansas Department of Agriculture to recognize farmsteads that have been in continuous operation by family members for more than 100 years.

"We are well-established up there in the Lodi community," Davis said of his farm, in which he raises cattle and poultry.

Davis also serves as the pastor of a Lockesburg church, calling it a "blessing" of his thirty years of service there.

He said that when he was asked to fill-in for the position until it again comes up for election, he was ready and willing to help, and states that he comes into the position without a specific agenda.

"I'm just going to join hands and see what I can help [the county] do. From my perspective, I don't see any specific needs that need immediate addressing. I don't come in with complaints or issues, I just came in to help and help support Judge Mack and the other [county] offices."

He also said he understands the value of quality board members in relations to the work he has seen his school board members achieve over the years, especially in the areas of support and problem solving.

"I just want to be that kind of person for the county," Davis said. "I'm just a citizen trying to help make a little better situation for Pike County."

Pike County Judge Dewight Mack is confident that Davis will play a positive role in his term as Justice of the Peace.

"I am thrilled that he's willing to do this for the people of Pike County -- I know what kind of person he is and he is a good man," said Mack. "I am tickled to death."

### Management of Traveler's Diarrhea

Traveler's diarrhea (TD) is an infection of the intestines that happens during, or shortly after a trip to a foreign country. The infection is often a result of unsanitary conditions in local restaurants, such as unclean or contaminated cooking utensils. The most common bacteria that causes the infection is Escherichia coli (E. coli). In addition to frequent diarrhea, symptoms may include stomach cramps and tiredness. Antibiotics work by killing bacteria that may have invaded the digestive tract. Commonly prescribed antibiotics are the drugs levofloxacin (Levaquin) and ciprofloxacin (Cipro). For relief from diarrhea, loperamide (Imodium) may be used. It works by slowing digestion and decreasing the number of bowel movements. Frequent diarrhea may also cause dehydration, in which case oral preparations such as Pedialyte (various electrolytes and nutrients) may be obtained over-the-counter to replace lost fluids.

First, we must recognize our dependence on God. Without that none of the other characteristics have a chance of appearing in us. We must learn to mourn over our sin, realizing that we are fools to demand justice because what we need is mercy. **STATE CAPITOL WEEK IN REVIEW**

LITTLE ROCK – Acts 78 and 79 of 2017 created the Arkansas Tax Reform and Relief Legislative Task Force. The leaders of the Senate and House have appointed the panel's membership.

There will be eight senators and eight representatives on the task force, which is charged with recommending changes to the state tax code for lawmakers to consider during the 2019 regular session.

Acts 78 and 79 are identical versions of a tax relief measure. One version originated in the Senate and the other one in the House of Representatives.

According to the acts, the recommended legislation should modernize and simplify the Arkansas tax code, while making it fairer for all individuals and businesses that pay taxes in Arkansas. Also, the changes should make Arkansas more competitive economically with other states and should provide incentives for job creation.

By December 1, 2017, the task force shall issue a preliminary report. Its final written report is to be released by September 1, 2018.

Acts 78 and 79 also reduce individual income taxes for more than 1.3 million low-income residents. When they take full effect they will save Arkansas families more than \$50 million a year. The largest tax cut a single taxpayer will receive is \$156 and for a married couple the saving will be \$312 each year.

All individuals earning less than \$21,000 will see lower income taxes. Those making less than \$4,300, an estimated 120,000 Arkansas residents, will be taken off the rolls completely.

The tax cuts in Acts 78 and 79 will take effect in 2019. Other tax cuts enacted this year include Act 141, which will completely exempt military retirement from state income taxes and will save about 29,000 retired Arkansas veterans more than \$13.4 million a year.

Act 465 exempts sales taxes for manufacturers when they purchase equipment for repairs and replacement of parts. It sunsets an existing tax incentive program known as InvestArk.

The tax exemption will be phased in. In Fiscal Year 2020 the savings to Arkansas manufacturers will be only \$230,000, but they will then begin to increase sharply. By 2023 the savings for Arkansas manufacturers will be more than \$12.3 million a year.

The legislature lowered income taxes in 2015 by more than \$100 million a year with the passage of Act 22. It reduces individual income taxes for middle class families whose annual income is between \$21,000 and \$75,000.

Act 1173 of 2015 lowers the state income tax on capital gains, and now saves Arkansas taxpayers almost \$12 million a year.

Tabor Community, (every body had a middle name then, didn't they?) Some of the local residents will remember her though they may never have known her husband:

He was the son of Floyd and Arkie Hawkins of the Mountain Home, Arkansas area, and was married to Joe Small in 1956. Funeral services were held at 10 AM, Wednesday, May 10, 2017, in the Davis Smith Funeral Home Chapel in Glenwood, with burial in the Mt. Tabor Cemetery.

Doug was a very personable person, was well liked, and easy to get acquainted with. He was well thought of in our family, and he will be missed.

I am happy to report good news about my eye. Last month when I saw the doctor, the pressure was 27 in my eye.
