## News Briefs

### Early voting is underway

MOUNT IDA - Early voting has begun in Montgomery County for the upcoming primary election to be held May 22.

Early voting began Monday, May 7, and will conclude Monday, May 21. Registered voters can vote early at the Montgomery County Courthouse Annex which is located at 117 Ray Drive in Mount Ida. Early voting hours will be from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays.

Registered voters will have five voting centers to choose from on election day, Tuesday, May 22. You can vote at Mount Tabor Church (58 Old Mt. Tabor Road, Glenwood), Lake Ouachita Baptist Church (3586 Highway 270E, Mount Ida), Montgomery County Annex (117 Ray Drive, Mount Ida), Norman City Hall (13 Golf Course Road, Norman), and Pencil Bluff Fire Station (138 Pencil Bluff Drive, Pencil Bluff)

Those wishing to vote may vote at any of the voting stations on the day of the election.

Although there are no contested local races on the primary level, two one percent sales tax issues will have long lasting effects on the county.

The two sales tax issues are related to the proposed construction of a new criminal justice facility. One of the sales taxes is entitled the "Law Enforcement Tax" will be a permanent tax that will be used by the sheriff's office to maintain the proposed facility with additional funds going to further local law enforcement efforts.

The other sales tax issue is labeled the "Bond Tax," which will expire when the bond to pay for the proposed facility is paid in full. The issue also approves the issuance of bonds valued at \$8,790,000 to pay for the construction of the facility.

Contested statewide races include Democratic and Repub-

### Forga leads sprinters at state meet

**Rare tie in 100M dash highlights high level of competition in 1A State Meet**

MINERAL SPRINGS - Mount Ida Senior Luke Forga and Keyon Williams of Maumelle Charter School shared in a rare experience last week as the pair finished the finals of the 100M dash at the 1A state meet in a tie.

Forga and Williams set the standard in the preliminaries with Wil-

liams finishing first just five hundredths of a second ahead of Forga. Spectators gathered along the track in anticipation as the gun sounded in the finals as eight of the fastest sprinters in 1A flew down the track toward the finish line. Forga and Williams were side by side through most of the race with each crossing the line at the 11.21 second mark.

A tie has been rendered virtually impossible with the inclusion of computer assisted timing systems.

### City officials working to complete action plan after March levee breach

MOUNT IDA - Members of the Mount Ida Waste Water Treatment Plant team continue to work toward a permanent fix on an equalization basin levee after record rainfall in February forced an emergency breach of a levee on the basin.

According to James Stanley, the treatment plant's operator, the Ouachita River has slowly been changing course near the basin. Build up of gravel bars in the South Fork of the river have forced a redirection in the river which drives it closer to the basin. The record rainfall in February, which saw over 14 inches of rain fall over the course of nine days, along with the changing course of the river caused damage to the levee which separates the basin from the river.

Waste Water Superintendent Trey Fiorello stated that he notified Stanley on March 5 of erosion he had found on the levee. The erosion had caused a portion of the outside levee wall to slough off.

Stanley said that the erosion was significant and photos revealed a large area of the levee wall that had been sloughed off by erosion. It was determined that if something wasn't done the levee was at risk of collapsing.

Fiorello stated that he also notified Mayor Jo Childress, County Judge Sammy Jones, County ADEM Coordinator Jerry Elizandro about the problem. City employees discussed an emergency fix on the inside of the levee which the mayor approved.

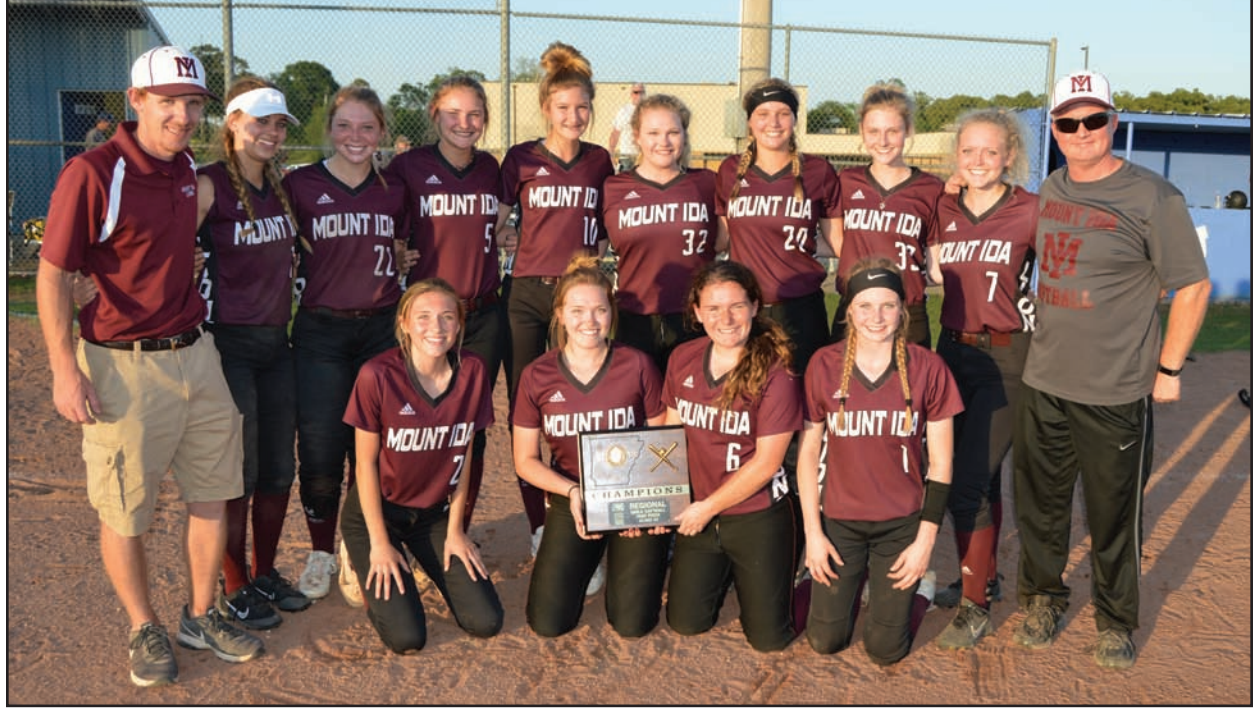

DIERKS - The Mount Ida Lions opened the 1A Region 4 Tournament with an impressive 14-4 victory over Scranton to punch their ticket to the 1A State Tournament to be held this week in Mountain Home.

The Lions opened the regional tournament with a whisper, scoring two runs in the first three innings. Things picked up in the fourth inning with Mount Ida rattling off seven runs in the top of the inning. Scranton responded with four in the bottom half of the inning, but Mount Ida held a commanding 9-4 lead.

The Lions would score two in the fifth and three in the sixth with Drew Allen

recording a home run in the inning.

Allen went three for four with a homer and two runs scored. Cade Jackson had a triple and a run score while going two for three at the plate. Colton Yates, Seth Breashears and Todd Carr each went two for three with a double and a run scored. Ty Abernathy went two for four with a double and two runs scored. Lagrange also hit a double.

The Lions' fortune turned south in the semi-final game with the Dierks Outlaws defeating them 9-0.

Trey Fiorello and Todd Carr recorded the only hits of the game for Mount Ida.

Dierks held a 1-0 lead going into the fourth where they scored five runs. They

added four in the sixth to earn the win.

Mount Ida lost a heart-breaker in the consolation game with County Line sneaking away with a 3-2 victory.

The first inning ended with a 1-1 tie, but County Line was able to slip out to a 3-1 lead in the second inning. Mount Ida scored one in the third, but was unable to earn the win.

Cade Helms hit a double, while Colton Yates went 2-4 with a run scored. Ty Abernathy was 2-3 and Trey Fiorello was 1-3. Cade Jackson scored a run.

Mount Ida enters the 1A State Baseball Tournament as a four seed from the 1A Region 4. They will face Bradley Wednesday at 2:30 p.m. at Cooper Park in Mountain Home.

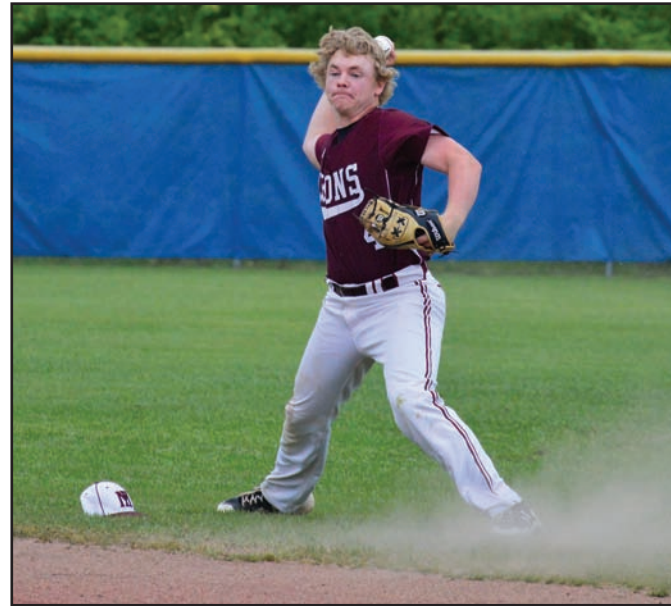

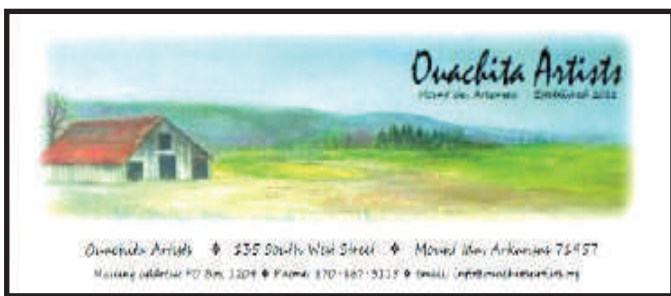

MAKING SENSE OF INVESTING



Do you have something that you don't use anymore, but that you don't want to throw away? Many people keep things that remind them of the past. Sometimes they keep old toys, dolls, or sports equipment that they once used. They may keep letters, ticket stubs, or postcards.

help us remember events of the past are called memorabilia.

Two American artist who painted collections of memorabilia were William Harnett and John Peto. These two men were friends who spent their lives making realistic paintings that were as true to life as photographs.

They used everyday objects and arranged them into interesting compositions which they recorded for history.

You may want to assemble your own collection into a three-dimensional art form called assemblage. If you are an artist you can paint or draw these items and frame your composition. If you are a photographer, try bringing your collection together and making an artistic picture of the group, perhaps enhancing the result with special use of light.

An assemblage, or collection of odds and ends may be arranged to create a three-dimensional

work of art in a "memory box." Shadow boxes can be purchased at craft or hobby shops, or if you are handy at woodworking you can construct your own. Paint the inside and outside of the box with a dark color which will help unify the items in the box. A collection around a theme that expresses parts of your past or present life might include stamps, sea shells, dried flowers, baseball cards, ticket stubs, buttons or scraps of fabric. Select items that have contrasting shapes, textures, and colors. Experiment with different arrangements to create a pleasing composition, then glue the parts down. Let the glue dry, then cover with glass or clear plastic to display your three-dimensional still life assemblage.

Get more pointers on photography at the next Photography Club meeting on Saturday, May 12 at Ouachita Artists Gallery and Studio in Mt. Ida. The meeting starts at 10 a.m. and this month will feature pointers from local photographer, Ken Haley.

On Monday, May 21 the Ouachita Artists program meeting will focus on watercolor methods presented by Caren Kennedy Gardner. This session starts at 2 p.m.. Both these meetings are free and open to the public, and will be held in the Shaw Studio behind the Gallery. Call 870-867-3115 with questions.

If the bonds are approved, there will be levied within the County a new 1% sales and use tax (the "Bond Tax"), the net collections of which remaining after deduction of the administrative charges of the State of Arkansas and required rebates will be used solely to retire or pay obligations with respect to the bonds in accordance with Amendment No. 62 to the Arkansas Constitution. The Bond Tax will expire after the bonds have been paid or provision is made therefor in accordance with Arkansas statutes. In order to provide additional funds to pay or to further secure repayment of the bonds, the County may also pledge to the bonds the net collections of the Law Enforcement Tax if the Law Enforcement Tax is separately approved by the voters. The issuance of the bonds is not dependent on the Law Enforcement Tax being approved.

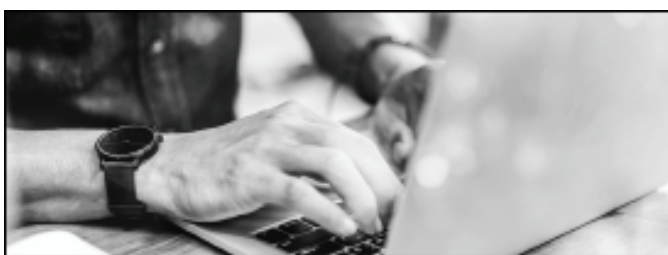

was contacted about when he could perform the emergency fix on the inside of the levee.

Waste Water employees also contacted the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission's stream erosion specialist for assistance in devising a plan for a permanent solution to the problem.

The city proceeded with a controlled drawdown over the course of a week. They had to cut a small portion of the levee to allow untreated water out of the levee which much of it made its way into the river.

Stanley and Fiorello were both adamant that the water release was

untreated, but it wasn't raw sewage.

ADEQ had one complaint of raw sewage being dumped into the Ouachita River. An investigation was conducted by ADEQ, which included an inspection. No violations were noted at the time.

The report states that the drawdown occurred for a week with approximately 3.875 million gallons of untreated water being released from the basin. This dropped the level of the basin 15

inches which allowed them to complete the emergency fix on the levee.

The city is in the process of coming up with a permanent fix on the levee.

Mount Ida also had water tests performed to check for possible contaminants in the water. The tests which are performed by a third party, determined that biochemical oxygen levels were four times greater than the permitted amount. PH levels

were also over the permitted limit, but total suspended solids and E.coli levels were well below permitted levels.

Emergency releases of untreated waste water are never desirable, but they aren't uncommon. The Mount Ida breach is one of 12 reported to the ADEQ in the past 12 years by local municipalities. This is the only reported controlled breach at the Mount Ida facility in that time period.

Reports from Little

Rock and Hot Springs media have drawn attention to the breach have drawn renewed interest to the incident which occurred two months ago. Mayor Childress stated that they are working diligently to create an action plan that will provide a permanent fix for the levee.

She stressed that although this isn't something the city wanted to do, it more than likely prevented a much larger breach at the time of the heavy rain event.

To the Residents of Montgomery County,

I have had the honor and privilege of working for you the past 35 years in the Sheriff and Collector's Office. As we know, times and laws have changed since 1983. Everyone has opinions, these are my thoughts on the new jail proposal:

The State can come in at any time and require the County to close our current jail, as we are unable to meet state standards in our current facility. This would require transportation of all inmates to other counties which would increase man hours for transport and reduce number of officers on call within the county. Also, there is no law requiring other counties to house our inmates. If they are willing to continue housing our inmates the costs to the County would increase astronomically. If they are not willing, we would have another situation we do not want to consider

(arrest made, but unable to detain in jail).

The current sales tax request makes more sense to me for three reasons: One: Sales tax will be shared by all residents, visitors and tourists paying sales tax in Montgomery County, with a county cap of \$25.00 on large purchase items over \$4,000. Two: It will not apply to groceries and medical prescriptions. Current sales tax for Montgomery County is 7.5% (State - 6.5%; County - 1%) with an additional 1% for Mount Ida City Tax. We are already paying higher sales tax for purchases outside our county. Three: Sales Tax was chosen as a funding option instead of asking for an increase of four mills to personal and real estate property taxes.

Once we pass the 2 cent sales tax, the bidding process will begin on the project, with all bids opened and awarded by Montgomery County. Local contractors will be able to bid on the project, providing jobs for local people and businesses.

As several of you remember in the 1990's we

had the State 309 Program in our county. The State paid the county for housing non-violent state inmates who were placed on a work detail where they would pick-up trash on county and state roads, clean cemeteries and help the cities with projects and other areas where needed. This is a great program which will help our County in many ways. We will be able to have this 309 Program with the new jail.

Many people are unaware State law does not allow a jail to hold individuals with a misdemeanor offense in the same cell area with individuals that are felons. This is the reason we have Arrest Warrants that haven't been served at this time. The new jail will allow Montgomery County to house individuals with misdemeanor's and felons at the same time. Individuals with misdemeanors could be detained in jail until they pay their warrants/fines.

Anyone can pull figures from somewhere, but until you ask someone involved in the project, they may not

be factual. There is one gentleman I have personally heard that continues to berate your elected County Clerk and County Judge in the Courthouse about figures and information, but has yet to talk to your Sheriff about the project.

Some people may think I am writing this because I work for the Sheriff. Well, I do, however I will be retiring in 2020 and as a County resident I want to know there is a place to put lawbreakers, getting them off the streets. I realize the new jail is needed and I would much rather see it paid for with the 2 cent sales tax (of which one cent, will drop when it is paid) by everyone (residents, visitors & tourists) instead of raising the personal and real estate property taxes for the residents of Montgomery County.

As I stated earlier, times and laws have changed since 1983. Today, it takes everyone working together to protect the people and their properties.

Remember to vote YES for both of the 1 cent sales tax proposals on May 22nd.

## LETTER TO THE EDITOR

I will get straight to the point. Our new proposed jail. We are being told it's a great deal, we need it, the time is right, but I disagree. We are not Garland County, we don't have their jobs nor their wealth. School enrollment is down in Oden and in Mount Ida because there isn't a good way to make a living here. If you didn't inherit your family's farm or wealth, making a living here can be tough. When I was a young man, there was a chicken house on every farm. The shoe factory employed many. Oden had a ranger station. These are all gone. How are we going

to pay for this new jail? If our economy was rolling, people had good jobs, we might afford the jail, but with so many barely making it, a new tax hike seems like a horrible idea. We are taxed to death: income tax, social security, state tax, property tax, sales tax, etc. People have had to cutback and learn to live within our means, BUT GOVERNMENT HAS NOT.

The jail, 7 million dollars? This is Montgomery County, not Little Rock, do we really need this? Personally, I think we have a fine sheriff's department, fine officers that do a great

job, but 7 million seems excessive. There is no crime wave to justify this. A better plan would be to remodel and expand our existing facilities rather than put this additional burden on our already struggling citizens.

I offer a compromise. Rather than a new sales tax, lift the ban on the sale of alcohol in our county. I'm not promoting drinking, but hear me out. This isn't the horse and buggy days. It's a 15 minute drive from Mt. Ida to Crystal Springs where you can buy a truckload of liquor. I'm 55 years old, the dry county

never prevented anyone from getting alcohol. As little time as it takes to get to Crystal Springs, if you want it, you will have it. We have lost enough tax revenue to Garland County to build several jails. Let our convenience stores sell beer, and have a couple of liquor stores in mt. Ida. This would keep OUR tax dollars here, and would pay for the jail without taxing our people further. This I could support, but not additional taxes on the backs of our hardworking people.

### HOW CAN I AVOIC PROBATE COURT?

*Lindsey*, when you designate that an annuity or an IRA is to pay at death to a specific person rather than to a trust, is probate required?  
- Dana

Dana, Thanks for the question. There are four main ways to keep a financial account out of probate court. You can: 1) grant full or partial ownership of the account to another person, 2) transfer ownership of the account to a trust, 3) name another person as death beneficiary on the account, or 4) name a trust as death beneficiary on the account.

Any one of these four options will keep the account out of probate court. In

direct response to your question, naming a specific person as death beneficiary is fine for that purpose, even if you have a trust.

Deciding between the four probate-avoiding options listed above can be difficult, though. Several other factors can enter the picture. For instance, some options give you greater control over your account until your death while some give less. Some options have better tax consequences than others. With some options, you can change your mind at any time; with others you're locked in. Some options can even help shelter your accounts against the high costs of long-term care.

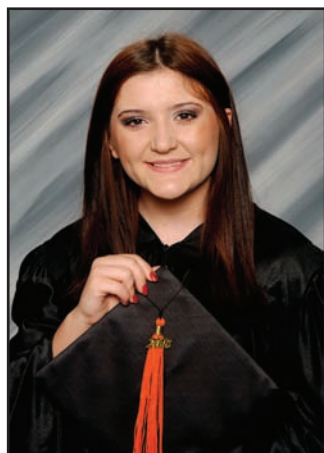

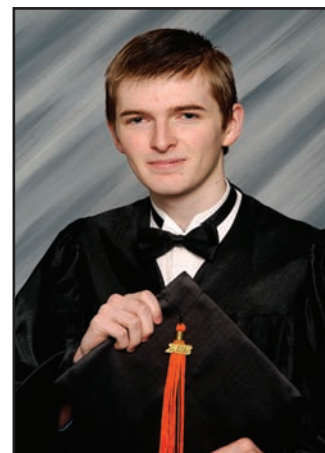
